To the County Board of the County of Anoka,
State of Minnesota: The undersigned land owners, whose lands will be liable to be affected by,
or assessed for, the expense of the construction
of the public ditch and branches hereinafter
described, respectfully represent that the public
health, convenience and welfare require the establishment and construction of a public ditch
and branches along the following described route
in the towns of Ham Lake and Grow in said
county of Anoka, and that the establishment and
construction of the same will be of public health,
and is necessary for the following reasons,
among others, to-wit: The 'etritory to be
drained by the proposed public ditch and branches
consists of a large basin or area of low meadow,
marsh and bog land, having but limited outlets
for surface waters, and which is overflowed and
covered with stagnant water to a considerable
anticlusion of the northeast one-quarter, the
southwest one-quarter of the northeast one-quarter,
the northwest one-quarter and the northwest one-quarter of the southwest one-quarter,
all in section nine, and the southwest one-quarter,
section eight, to the point where said county
ditch number four joins said county ditch number
two, and thence generally along the course of
said county ditch number two through sections
eight, seven, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, and
