State of Minnesota, County of Anoka, ss.
In the matter of the petition of Ben Swanson and others for a public ditch in the County of Anoka and State of Minnesota.

Notice is Hereby Given, That a petition has been filed in the office of the county auditor of said county, praying for the construction of a public ditch, the route of which is described as follows:

Main Ditch—Commencing at Station 00 on the north and south center line of Section 27, Township 32, Range 23, distant 330 feet south of the northeast corner of the southwest quarter, Section 27, Township 32, Range 23; thence running in a westerly direction through Sections 27, 28 and terminating at a point near the west line of Section 29 in said town and range; said point being 230 feet east of the west line and 570 feet south of the north line of the southwest quarter of the northwest quarter, Section 29, Township 32, Range 23; same being widening, deepening and straightening of Coon Creek through said section according to petition.

Branch No. 1—Commencing at a point 320 feet west of the east line and 140 feet south of north line of northwest quarter of southeast quarter, Section 32, Town 32, Range 23; thence running in a northerly direction through said Sections 32 and 29, and terminating in the main ditch at Station 158 plus 30, together with lateral "A" lying in Sections 32 and 33, said town and range.

Branch No. 2—Commencing at a point 30 feet north of south line, and 370 feet west of east line of northwest quarter of southwest quarter, Section 21, Town 32, Range 23; thence running southerly through Section 21 and terminating in main ditch in Section 23, Town 32, Range 23, at Station 111 plus 20, together with laterals "A" and "B" lying in said Section 21.
