JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT
FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS
AT LAKE DRIVE AND ELM STREET
IN THE CITY OF LINO LAKES

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 25th day of February, 1997, by and between the County of Anoka, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, 2100 Third Avenue, Anoka Minnesota 55303, hereinafter referred to as the "County", and the City of Lino Lakes, 1189 Main Street, Lino Lakes, Minnesota 55014, hereinafter referred to as the "City".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement desire to provide for the installation and maintenance of a traffic signal at Elm Street and County State Aid Highway No. 23 (Lake Drive) in the City of Lino Lakes; and,

WHEREAS, the parties agree that it is in their best interest that the maintenance of said signal be undertaken by both the City and County; and,

WHEREAS, Minn. Stat. § 471.59 authorizes political subdivisions of the state to enter into joint powers agreements for the joint exercise of powers common to each.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually stipulated and agreed as follows:

I. PURPOSE:

The parties have joined together for the purpose of providing for the installation and maintenance of a traffic control signal at Elm Street and County State Aid Highway No. 23 (Lake Drive).

II. METHOD:

A. The City shall install the traffic control signal system at Elm Street and County State Aid Highway No. 23 (Lake Drive). The County shall assist in the construction inspection of the traffic control system as deemed necessary by the County.

B. The County Highway Department shall maintain the traffic signal controller, traffic signal lamps, loop detectors, associated wiring of the traffic control system and traffic signal painting at the sole cost of the City.

C. The City will be responsible for the electrical power installation and ongoing power cost, construction costs and the maintenance, relamping and painting of the luminaires of the traffic control signal.

D. All timing of the traffic control signal shall be determined by the County.

E. Only the County shall have access to the controller cabinet.

F. The traffic control signal shall be the property of the County.

III. COSTS:

A. The City shall be billed at the completion of construction for any construction inspection performed by the County.

B. The City shall be billed quarterly for all costs incurred by the County for routine and emergency maintenance. Costs will include employee time, equipment time, materials and overhead. The City shall also reimburse the County for costs incurred if the County contracts out any of the work contemplated herein. The City shall reimburse the County within forty-five (45) days of receipt of an invoice describing the costs incurred by the County.

C. The City shall be responsible for all costs associated with the installation of the traffic control signal system, the ongoing power costs and all maintenance costs as described herein.

IV. TERM:

This Agreement shall continue until (1) terminated as provided hereinafter.

V. DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS:

All funds disbursed by the County or City pursuant to this Agreement shall be disbursed by each entity pursuant to the method provided by law.

VI. CONTRACTS AND PURCHASES:

All contracts let and purchases made pursuant to this Agreement shall be made by the City in conformance to state laws.

VII. STRICT ACCOUNTABILITY:

A strict accounting shall be made of all funds, and report of all receipts and disbursements shall be made upon request by either party.

VIII. TERMINATION:

This Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time, with or without cause, upon not less than thirty (30) days written notice delivered by U.S. mail or in person to the other party. If notice is delivered by U.S. mail, it shall be deemed to be received two (2) days after mailing. In the case where the City terminated said Agreement, the signal system shall be removed at the City's sole expense prior to termination. Such termination shall not be effective with respect to any solicitation of bids or any purchase of service or goods which occurred prior to such notice of termination. The City shall pay all costs incurred by the County prior to such notice of termination.

IX. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION:

In accordance with the County's Affirmative Action Policy and the County Commissioners' policies against discrimination, no person shall illegally be excluded from full-time employment rights in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the program which is the subject of this Agreement on the basis of race, creed, color, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, public assistance status, age, disability or national origin.

X. NOTICE:

For the purpose of delivery of any notices hereunder, the notice shall be effective if delivered to the County Administrator of Anoka County, 2100 Third Avenue, Anoka, Minnesota 55303, on behalf of the County, and the City Manager of the City of Lino Lakes, 1189 Main Street, Lino Lakes, Minnesota 55014, on behalf of the City.

XI. INDEMNIFICATION:

The City and the County mutually agree to indemnify and hold harmless each other from any claims, losses, costs, expenses or damages resulting from the acts or omissions of the respective officers, agents, or employees relating to activity conducted by either party under this Agreement.

XII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT/REQUIREMENTS OF A WRITING:

It is understood and agreed that the entire agreement of the parties is contained herein and that this Agreement supersedes all oral agreements and all negotiations between the parties relating to the subject matter thereof, as well as any previous agreement presently in effect between the parties relating to the subject matter thereof. Any alterations, variations or modifications of the provisions of this Agreement shall be valid only when they have been reduced to writing and duly signed by the parties herein.

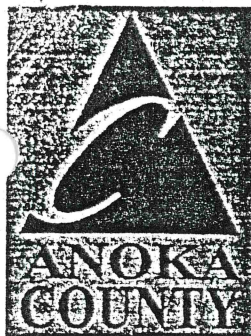

b) Anoka County Board of Commissioner's approval on February 25, 1997 to enter into agreement w/the City of Lino Lakes for maintenance to be provided by the county.


